

e-KISPEST 2020 CUP 04.11. 10:00-tól 04.19. 20:00-ig EVALUATION



The e-KISPEST CUP '20 was not a pre-planned competition, but was inspired by the situation in the world. In fact, it was preceded only by a tight two-week preparation. We couldn't even fathom the amount of interest there was for the competition - thousands of people visited our website - which we thank you very much again.

Based on the official entries, 179 people from 10 countries on 2 continents took part in the competition. If we examine the distribution of the received race cartons, the domestic / international ratio was 81/19%. We did not have such an intention, but based on this, we can rightly call the competition international, which is another milestone in the life of the Gémes Hiking Association.

We are delighted that in many parts of the world we were able to make you forget the current situation for a few hours and managed to bring a little competitive atmosphere into everyday life. We hope that more people outside the competition were able to experience this atmosphere. We are especially glad that several participants were able to get to know the orienteering tour through us and also got a sense of it. We didn't ask for it, but thank you so much for renaming the filename of the submitted race card so that it can be easily identified after saving.

Only the exact answers were considered correct in the evaluation. In accordance with the worksheet, we gave +1 point for a good answer, -2 points for a bad answer, and 0 points for missing an answer. Checkpoint 41 was checked in the field due to the high number of wrong answers before the final result was determined, and the correct answer we came up with was found to be correct. We have to admit that the competition was not easy - as evidenced by the fact that the solution required several hours, which corresponds to a tour competition - but our goal - to provide several hours of special time - we were able to achieve.

The correct solutions and the location of all the buoys for the first task will be published not only in tabular form, but also on a separate solution map, thus facilitating self-monitoring, which will hopefully also be a useful pastime.

Congratulations to all participants for their achievements! Individual and team categories I-III. will be contacted after the state of emergency has been lifted so that we can agree on how to give out the won medals.

4 members of the Gémes Hiking Association took part in the successful organization of the competition, and Silvanus SE provided essential assistance by providing us with the competition map and updating the map to its current form. In addition, we are grateful to the professional and non-governmental organizations and individuals involved in the promotion of the competition.

Thank you very much for your comments / suggestions so far, which we will use to organize further competitions, so we encourage others to share their views on the competition - helping us with our work. We can already see that in the future, similar to the difficulty categories used in orienteering touring competitions, it is worth it to prepare with an easier set of tasks.

Thanks again for participating in the competition and for at least being able to meet virtually.

As the circumstances allow, the Gémes Hiking Association will carry out a number of programs, from tours to a wide range of orienteering competitions, about which more information will be available on the website <http://www.gemeste.hu/>. We will also try to keep the programs that were canceled due to the state of emergency at another time.
